7 Historical Events

Veterans Day National Movement Started in Alabama

<u>1945</u>: WW II ended. As November 11 approached, Raymond Weeks and others thought the USA should honor veterans of ALL wars (not just WW I) and work to perpetuate World Peace.

1946: Raymond Weeks and Alabama took action--planned the celebration, led a delegation to the Pentagon, and gained support from Gen. Dwight Eisenhower for "National Veterans Day 1947" to launch the next Nov. 11.

1947: Birmingham hosted the first Veterans Day with the World Peace Dinner (WWII Hero Gen. Omar Bradley keynote speaker), Memorial Service, Parade....General Eisenhower telegram endorsed.

1954: Birmingham created and presented the National Veteran Award.



7 Historical Events

(continued)

1982: Pres. Ronald Reagan presented "Raymond Weeks of Birmingham" the : Presidential Citizens Medal on national TV as the "driving force" for Veterans Day. Elizabeth Dole vetted Weeks and called him the "Father of Veterans Day."

2005: Tribute to the Founder of Veterans Day commemoration led by Patriotism in Action at the Weeks Monument placed by "a grateful nation."

2012: U.S. Senate affirmed Raymond Weeks-Birmingham-Alabama for starting Veterans Day in a resolution proposed by Patriotism in Action of Life Leaders.





Weeks Persevered 1947-54 (7 Years) until Veterans Day was federal law

President Eisenhower signed into law in 1954 the Act proclaiming November 11 as Veterans Day (Public Law 83-380 signed June 1).

That year, National Veterans Day in Birmingham created the National Veteran Award and Banquet and moved the World Peace Dinner to a luncheon.



2013 Honoree The Tuskegee Airmen of Alabama



Alabama has stood as national leader for Veterans Day, Human Rights, Freedom, and Patriotism.

1947, the nation's Veterans Day was created in Birmingham, Alabama. In 1954, President Eisenhower signed into law Veterans Day as a national holiday. Since 1954, the National Veteran Award has been sponsored and hosted in Birmingham.





Expressing the sense of the Senate regarding Raymond Weeks and his efforts in the establishment of Veterans Day.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

NOVEMBER 13, 2012

Mr. Sessions (for himself and Mr. Shelby) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate regarding Raymond Weeks and his efforts in the establishment of Veterans Day.

Whereas November 11, 2012, is the 65th anniversary of National Veterans Day in Birmingham, Alabama; Whereas the National Veterans Day in Birmingham is the longest running celebration of Veterans Day in the Nation:

Whereas, on November 11, 1946, World War II veteran Raymond Weeks presented General Eisenhower a program design proposing to replace Armistice Day with a National Veterans Day in 1947;

Whereas the very first Veterans Day celebration was held in Birmingham by the National Veterans Day Organization in 1947;

Whereas President Eisenhower signed into law on June 1, 1954, the Act proclaiming November 11 as Veterans Day (Public Law 380; 83rd Congress);

Whereas in 1954, the National Veterans Day Volunteer Organization, started by Raymond Weeks, expanded to organize a multi-day celebration including, but not limited to, a Veterans Day Parade, a World Peace Luncheon, and presentation during the National Veterans Award Dinner of the National Veterans Award:

Whereas these three events have been held every year since 1954;

Whereas the briefing for President Reagan by Elizabeth Dole for the Presidential Citizens Medals cited Raymond Weeks as the 'Father of Veterans Day';

Whereas President Reagan recognized Raymond Weeks as the driving force behind Veterans Day while presenting Raymond Weeks with the Presidential Citizens Medal on November 11, 1982;

Whereas Raymond Weeks should be recognized for his push to honor the great men and women who have served their country with a special day of recognition; and

Whereas Birmingham, Alabama, should be recognized for its contributions to the institution of Veterans Day: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate--

- (1) recognizes Birmingham, Alabama, as the home to the first and longest running celebration of Veterans Day;
- (2) recognizes Raymond Weeks for his pioneering efforts in the establishment of Veterans Day; and
- (3) honors the sacrifices of, and pays tribute to, the men and women of the United States in uniform who risk life and limb for their country at home and overseas.

Patriotism in Action book cover: President Ronald Reagan honored Raymond Weeks with the Presidential Citizens Medal at the White House in 1982 as the "driving force" for establishing America's Veterans Day.

U.S. history: Birmingham, Alabama hosted the first national celebration honoring all veterans in 1947 and started America's National Veteran Award in 1954, the year President Eisenhower signed Veterans Day into law as a federal holiday. The U.S. Senate led by Senators Sessions and Shelby passed a resolution in 2012 recognizing Alabama as home to the first and longest running celebration of Veterans Day.

Alabama: A national leader organizing Veterans Day celebrations, educational resources, and events to honor veterans, celebrate freedom, foster peace, and teach character traits to build good citizenship for America.



Veterans Day started in Alabama in 1947

Central Alabama can be a Top 5 U.S. destination for patriotic events and education.



November 11, 1946: General Dwight Eisenhower supported the proposed "National Veterans Day 1947" presented by Raymond Weeks, WWII veteran from Alabama. President Eisenhower signed Veterans Day into law in 1954. Weeks served Veterans Day for 40 years.

The U.S. Senate passed a resolution in November 2012:



Resolved by the United States Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), that Congress hereby recognizes Birmingham, Alabama, as the home to the first and longest running celebration of Veterans Day.


This official recognition restored and confirmed one of Alabama's most positive national distinctions.
